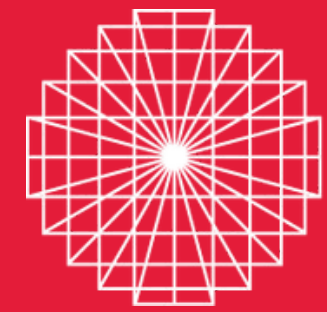
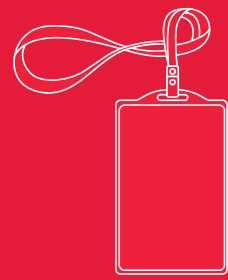


Atlas Language School Rathmines

during the excursions.)

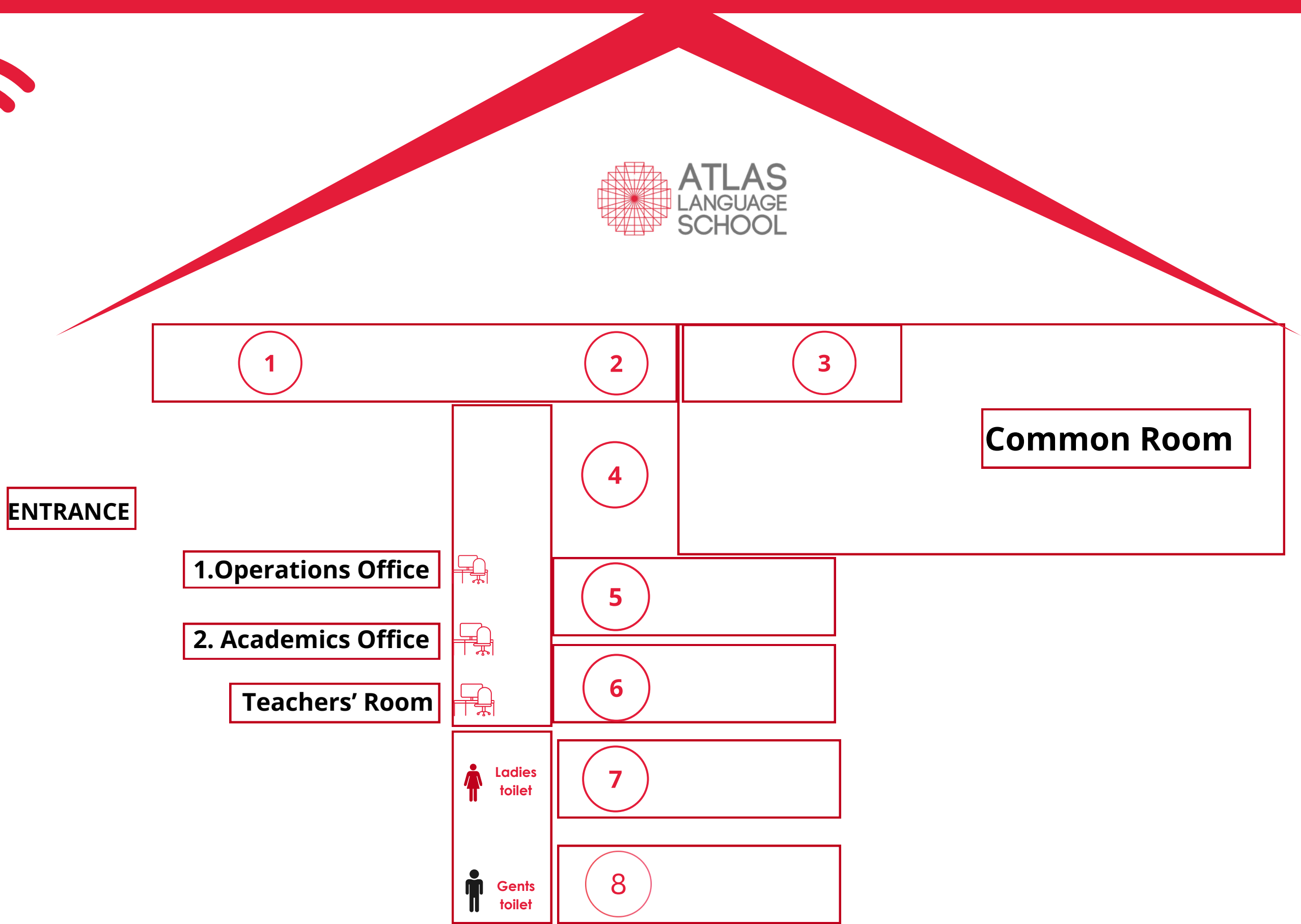

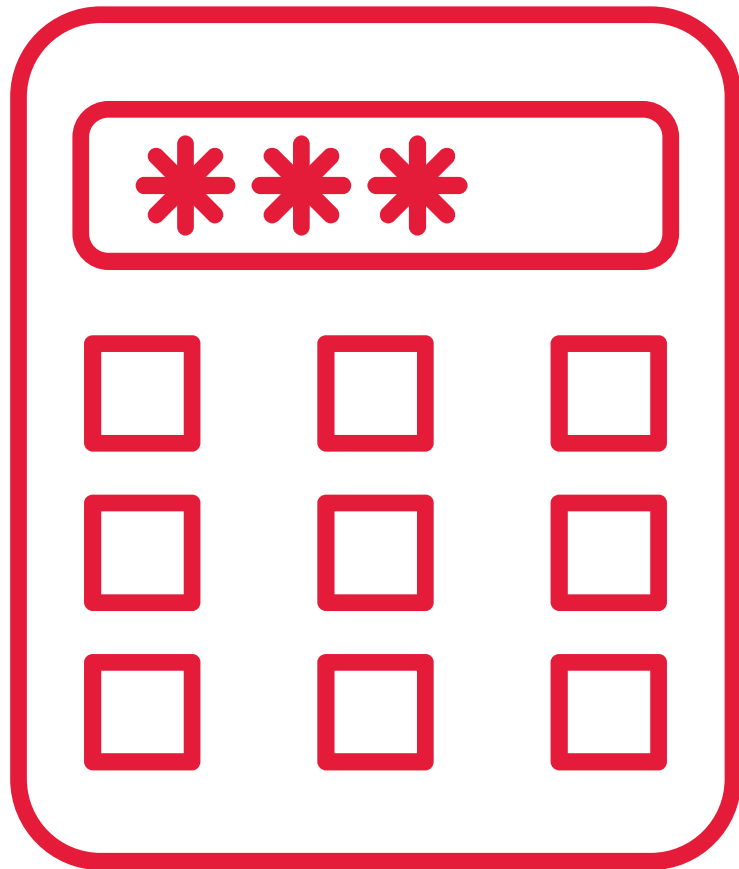

Make yourself familiar with and be aware of these escape routes



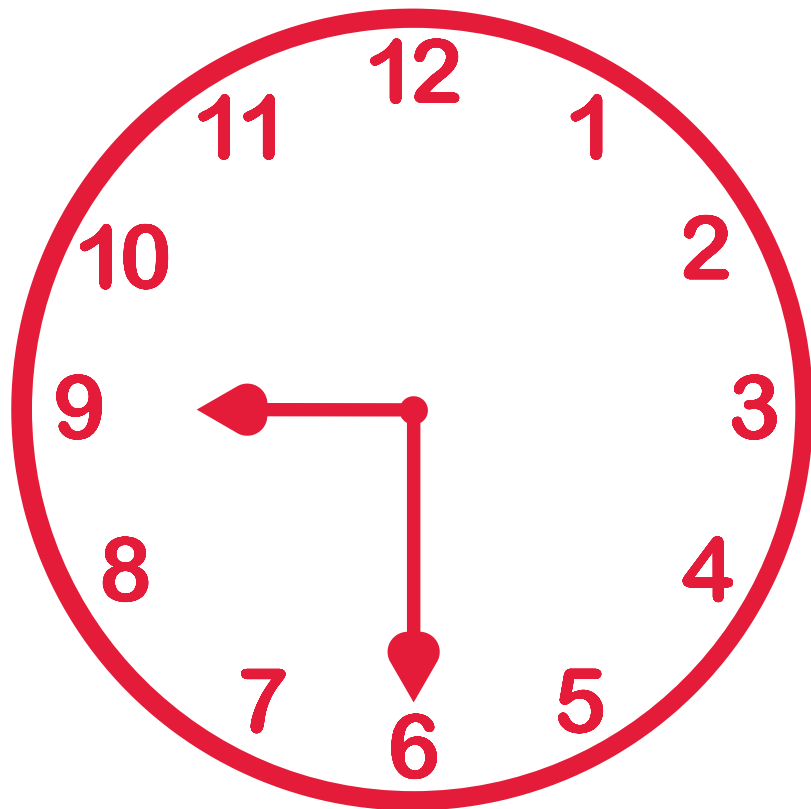
In case of an emergency evacuation, leave the building by the nearest fire exit, following your teachers' and the Fire Marshals' instructions

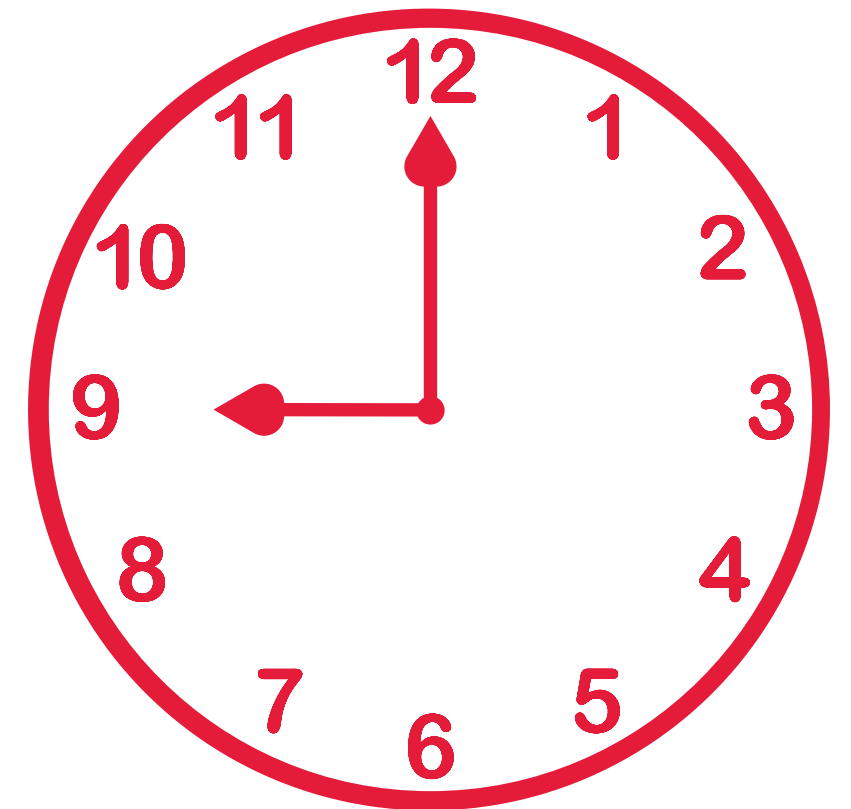

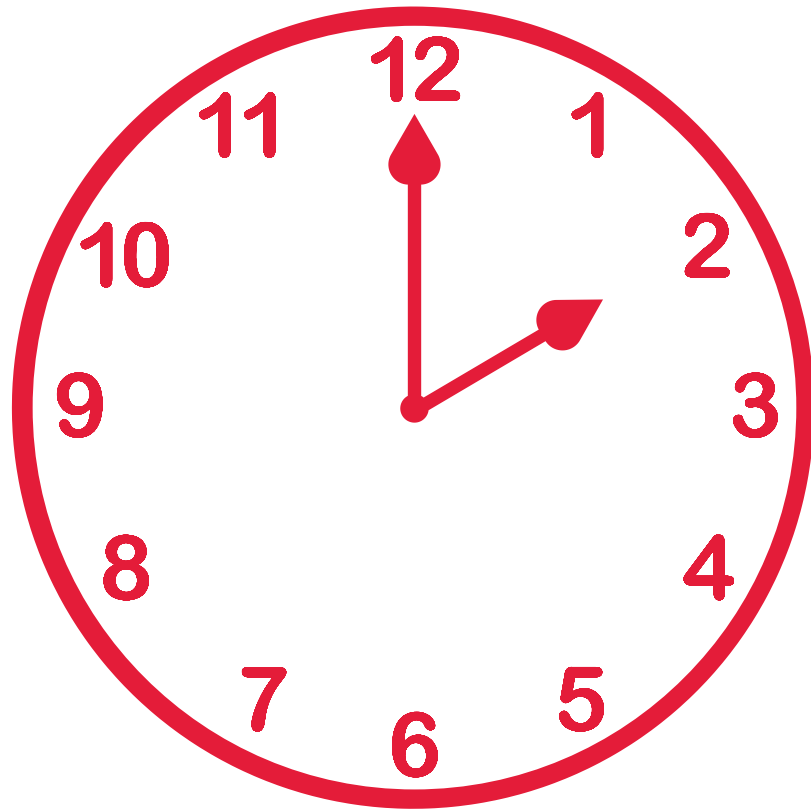

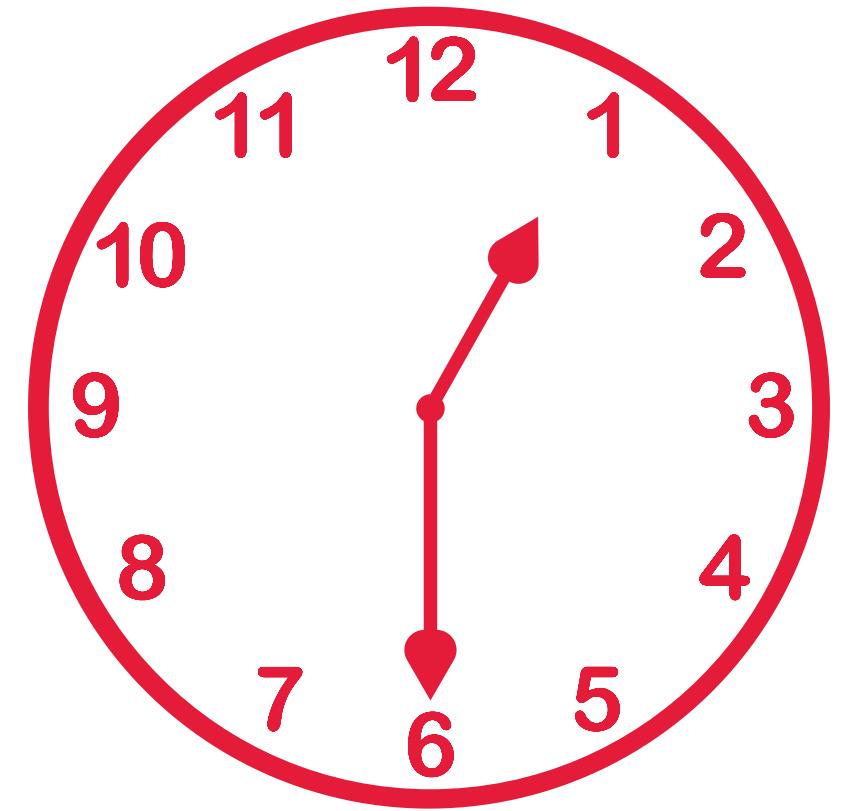

Your chosen time period starts from the first time you use the card.

Leap Visitor card is not valid on the Hop on/Hop off tour or other special tour services and cannot be used on Bus Éireann services.

TIPS FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORT



BUS

Tap your LEAP CARD when getting on a bus, but not when getting off.

If you forget your LEAP CARD, you can pay the bus driver in cash, keep in mind they won't give you change.



LUAS

Tap your LEAP CARD before you get on the tram and when you get off.

The Green line travels North to South and the Red line travels East to West.

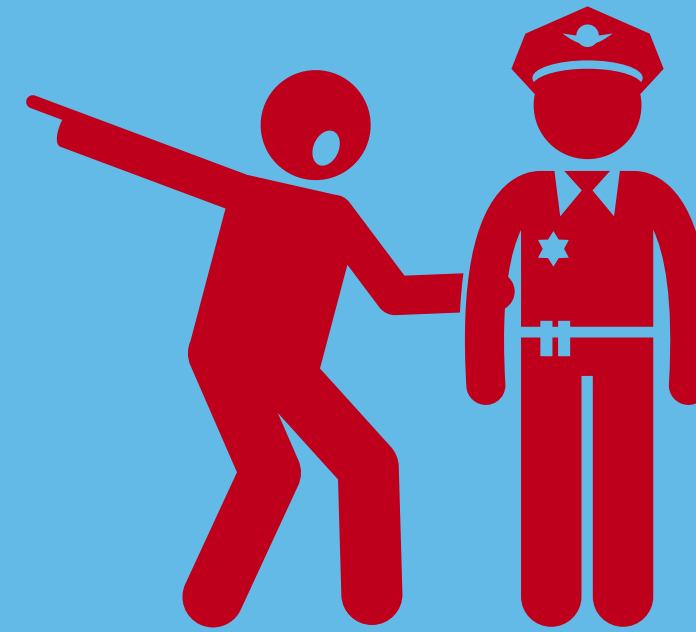

SAFETY TIPS

- Don't leave your drink unattended and never accept a drink from a stranger.
- Look out for your friends and make sure someone always knows where you are going.
- Try to avoid walking alone at night.
- Try not to be on your phone whilst walking in the street.
- Always carry a charged mobile phone with credit.
- If anything happens to you, report it to the police immediately and tell your leaders/host/the school.
- Don't leave your bag unattended.
- Keep your purse or wallet in an inside pocket.



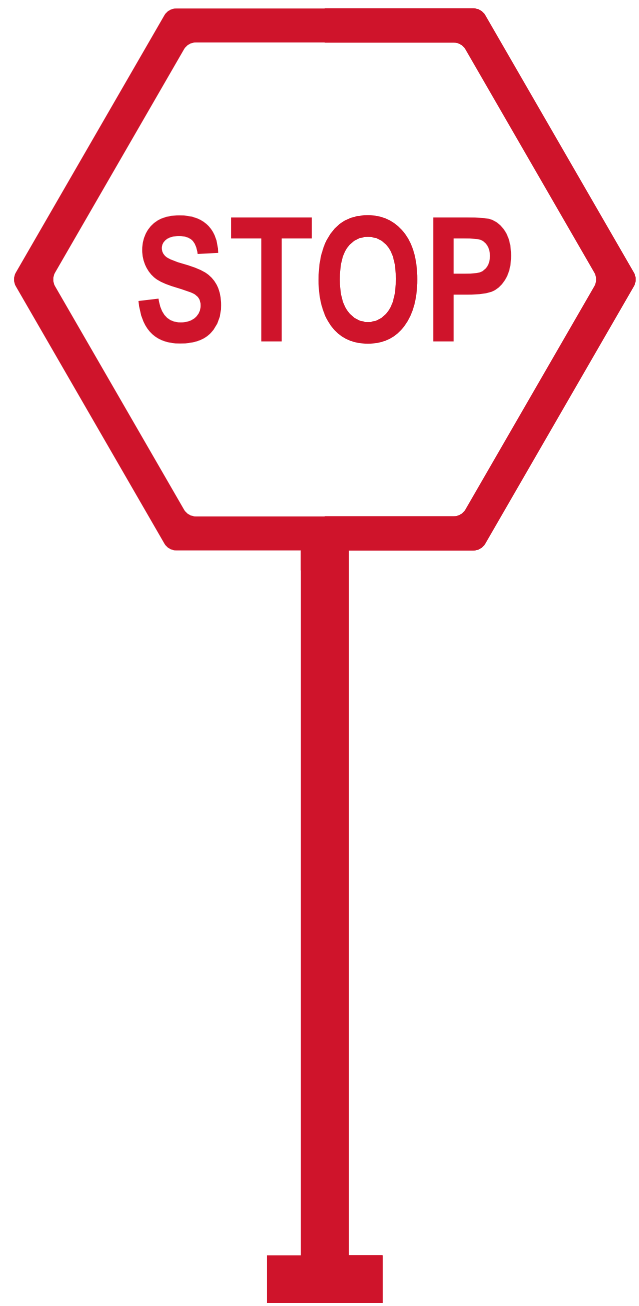


KEEP IN MIND

- Being with a host family is part of the experience.
- You are not only practicing your English at the school, you are practicing your English there as well. Ask as many times as you need. Families are expecting you to talk to them.
- A host family's house is a family home, and as in any other home, there will be rules that **must be followed**, such as a curfew, time for the meals, time for showers, cleanliness, etc.
- Host family accommodation is not self-catering, therefore, it is not allowed to use the kitchen at the host family's house.
- Host families have their own routines during the day (e.g. they go to work), and because of that they expect that their students will also have their own routine, generally between 9 am and 5 pm.
- It is important to say 'please' and 'thank you' in an Irish home.
- Smoking in the house is never permitted.
- Please don't be late for dinner.



- **IF YOU ARE UNDER 18 YEARS OLD YOU ARE CONSIDERED A MINOR.**
- Smoking in Ireland is illegal under the age of 18 and is banned in many public areas: Smoking is not allowed inside the school building or at the host family's house.
- It is illegal to buy or attempt to buy alcohol, tobacco or cigarettes if you are under 18.
- It is illegal to drink alcohol if you are under 18.
- Any student found in possession or under the influence of illegal drugs will be reported to the police.
- You are not allowed to carry a knife or any sort of weapon like defense sprays
- You must remember to pay for anything picked up in a shop. If you are caught shoplifting, the police will be called and heavy fines may be given. If the shop chooses to prosecute, this may result in a criminal conviction.



When crossing the road, **always look both ways** and listen because sometimes you can hear traffic before you can see it. **Cross at zebra crossings** whenever possible but do not step onto the crossing until the driver has stopped.
